

Councilor Walters called a meeting for May 25 th for Presidents of Ward 10 Community Leagues to meet with the new police chief to discuss raising crime levels in our area. The rise in the levels of crime in our League area was brought up by several people at the Annual General Meeting. The Edmonton Police Service has set up a "non-emergency" reporting number that we urge you to call to report any crime. It is important that we, as a community, report **all incidents**, small and large so that the EPS can assess the threat levels in our neighbourhood. **The number is 780 423 4567**.

We encourage you to lock your front doors all the time, remove garage door openers from your cars, make sure you lock your cars, and lock the door that leads from your garage into your home and make sure basement and main floor windows are closed and secure when you're not at home. When not in use, please store bikes in the garage or with a secure chain and lock – remember last year the weekly reports we had of bikes being stored in the back yard that were freed with the help of bolt cutters. As gardening season is upon EPC also encourages us to close the garage door when you are working out of sight. (continued pg 5)

What is a Community?!

I was trying to find a way to start a "discussion" on Community and found myself pondering what "community" is by today's standards...

I found an interesting piece by Fabian Pfortmüller that was quite thought provoking:

Community = a group of people that care about each other and feel they belong together.

So... my challenge to everyone in our Ermineskin/Steinhauer Community is get to know your neighbor! Think about this... if you get to know the person next to you... everyone will know someone in "THE HOOD".

Make a point of shaking hands, making real contact. It really does work!

Plan a mini block party... get 5 neighbors together with the barbeque. Talk about the issues in your immediate area.. Take some pictures and send them to us!

Neighborhood Watch... do you care enough about the security of your neighborhood to participate in this program?

Contact the office via email—eclinfo1@gmail.com or by phone 780-438-6623 or indicate willingness on Facebook. This can't happen without **YOU**!

Let's face it: no one likes to see needles on the ground. But do you always know what to do should you find one? It depends!

If you see a needle in a public space (park, alley, sidewalk), call 311 or report it using the 311 App. City staff aim to collect and dispose of the needle(s) within 2 hours of the call between 8am and 4pm, 7 days a week.

"Calling 311 or using the 311 App helps us to track the number of calls for needle collection, along with the number of needles collected," says Don Belanger, Program Manager, Capital City Clean Up. "This data helps us to make good decisions about where to best focus our efforts, and staff and citizens play a valuable role in this process."

But what if I find a needle on my property? There are <u>step-by-step instructions</u> to help you safely collect the needle.

The needle is safely secured. Now what? Needles can be disposed of at Eco Stations and at any one of 24 newly redesigned needle boxes located throughout the city. See our <u>needle disposal maps</u> for locations.
