An Update on Century Park

On May 28th at City Council Public Hearing we will be hearing from you, the public, and talking about some zoning changes to the Century Park developments. The Northwest corner of the lot ("Block L") was acquired by the developer after the approval of the original plan and while it was known at the time of application that they would be purchasing this parcel of land eventually - the zoning had to be brought back after the purchase to accommodate these changes.

With the adding of Block L the total unit count will be increasing from 3995 units to 4200 units. While this is an increase in the total number of units it will actually mean a small decrease in the density of the project given the added land.

We understand there are concerns about parking both now and in the future. After adding Block L there will be an increase of 195 temporary park and ride stalls before development starts. Of course, by 2025 all park and ride will be gone from this location. To handle all the park and ride users from the south, the Heritage Valley Park and Ride is being built. Construction is anticipated to begin this year and it will eventually hold 1,900 vehicles when it is fully complete.

As well, the current zoning requires a minimum number of parking stalls based on the number and types of units that are being developed. That means these extra units are going to be accommodated with more parking at the site, which will be either underground or in a parking garage.


The City and the developers have been working closely with the Ermineskin Community League; sharing information and knowledge make solutions that work for everyone. Through these talks a good neighbours agreement between the league and the developer was created to show that the developer will act in good faith and provide some reasonable assurances during construction. This includes a commitment to providing updates to the community and creating a line of communication for dispute resolution.

311 AND DRAINAGE

WHEN TO CALL



To report any drainage issues, you can call 311, 24-hours a day, 365 days per year. You can also contact 311 online or through the 311 app.

WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR REQUEST?

311 is how your drainage issue is reported to EPCOR for information tracking and any follow up.

All 311 calls are recorded and reviewed randomly for quality assurance purposes.

WHEN SHOULD YOU CALL 311?

Call 311 to report the following and EPCOR will follow up:

- Clogged catch basins
- Dislodged manhole covers
- Drainage trouble
- Sewer odour
- Illegal dumping into the drainage system

Call 311 to report the following for tracking purposes.

- Flooded streets
- Flooded basement or street
- Surface drainage, such as pooling on roads

Reporting this information will provide a better understanding of the impact of flooding in the community:

Note: Even a minor amount of standing water counts as flooding.

Steinhauer & Ermineskin Flood Mitigation Project

Project overview

Since 2004, the neighbourhoods of Steinhauer and Ermineskin have not experienced extensive flooding simply because the area has not had a major storm. However, the area has been identified as very vulnerable during a major storm event.

There is no stormwater management facility in either neighbourhood, and the current overland (or surface drainage system) is not effective. There are several areas in these neighbourhoods that sag and as a result water pools and has nowhere to drain. This puts the Steinhauer and Ermineskin neighbourhoods at risk of flooding during intense rainfall events.

In 2017, high-level drainage modelling of the neighbourhoods and a larger and more complex, system-wide technical review concluded that Steinhauer and Ermineskin would need additional measures to reduce the potential of future flooding.

The outcomes of the proposed project are to:

- Reduce and slow down stormwater going into the sanitary sewer system
- Reduce and mitigate potential future sanitary backup into basements

Project update

The project has been approved to move from the current preliminary design phase to the detailed design phase. The detailed design phase is tentatively scheduled for completion by the end of 2018. The project will include a dry pond. Extensive community consultation will be a part of determining the final design. Community consultation will include discussions about the size, location, and other details about the dry pond. These will then be factored into the final design.

Next steps

Once the concept options are finalized, a public information session will be held to show the community the modelling and results. This will include what information helped shaped the outcome; what's going to happen in the coming months; and an overall timeline update of the project, including potential construction impacts. Construction is expected to start in 2019 and will temporarily affect some recreation areas.

Has a dry pond concept already been selected?

No. The project is currently in the preliminary design phase which is where EPCOR looks at different solutions/options including more technical detail before an option is selected. The project has been approved to move into detailed design, which is tentatively scheduled for completion by end of 2018.

What areas of Steinhauer Park are being considered?

We are looking at all available park space within Ermineskin and Steinhauer to construct a pond to control the stormwater and to protect the community during extreme events.

What about our recreation amenities? Will we lose our skating rinks and toboggan hill?

As the project is still in the preliminary design phase, no concepts have been selected. Multiple options are being considered as potential locations for the dry pond. EPCOR will engage with the City and the community on how amenities may be impacted by the dry pond. 2 With the transition of Drainage Services to EPCOR, it is EPCOR's responsibility to build the dry pond and maintain the drainage infrastructure. However, the ownership and maintenance of the dry pond itself is a City of Edmonton responsibility.



Will the community have an opportunity to provide input to the project?

EPCOR is committed to working with the community to make sure community concerns and needs are understood, considered, and factored into the final concept. Once the different concept options have been developed, EPCOR will host an open house for the community to provide input into the concepts. This is expected to take place in late June 2018.

What is a dry pond?

A dry pond collects stormwater during heavy rain events when the stormwater system cannot handle the water volumes. During heavy storm events, the pond acts as a storage facility to minimize water collecting around homes, in basements, and on roadways. The water then drains from the pond into the stormwater sewer system once the flows in the system have diminished. The pond is dry most of the time and, depending on size, can be used for sport, recreation, or leisure purposes.

Are dry ponds safe?

A dry pond is built to minimize safety risk. The sides are gently sloped - anywhere from 5-10 feet in horizontal length for every one foot of vertical drop. It is kept relatively shallow, normally fewer than two metres, and hazard signs warn of the safety risk when ponds are wet. Recreation fields are graded so stormwater pools in the corners and along the sides first. This helps keep fields dry and drains them more quickly when they do become flooded. Water that does collect in a dry pond drains very quickly, often within an hour or two of a heavy rainfall. This is done by gravity through drains built into the bottom of the pond. Warning devices in the pond's drainage grates notify EPCOR when it is filling with water. EPCOR staff can be dispatched as necessary to ensure the site is safe.

When will the dry pond be constructed? How long will it take to build a dry pond?

Once the concept is finalized, we will be moving through to detailed design in 2018. Construction is expected to start in 2019, but exact timing is not available yet as it is dependent upon design outcomes, contractor timelines, and land acquisition. Construction will affect the area selected for about a year. It can take anywhere from 3-6 months to build a dry pond, depending on the size.

What will the construction activities and schedule be?

With respect to working hours, the construction schedule will follow the City of Edmonton Noise By-law. The specific activities and timing of the construction have yet to be determined. EPCOR will host a pre-construction open house for the community once construction information is available. Community notices will be sent throughout the project keeping you informed as work progresses. If you would like to be added to the mailing list, please contact epcordrainage@epcor.com.

What do I do if there is flooding in or near my home?

Even with broad-scale neighbourhood flood mitigation measures in place, your individual property can be at risk of flooding. There are several flood prevention homeowner programs to assist with this, such as the Flood Prevention Home Check Up, and the Backwater Valve Subsidy Program. 




